HS Grad Requirements

- Complete 44 Semester Credits (in specific areas)
- Pass the FitnessGram
- Earn a 2.0+ overall GPA in grades 9-12

High School UC/CSU a-g Course Requirements (32 credits)

- a. History 6 credits (3 yrs)
- b. English 8 credits (4 yrs)
- c. Math 6 credits (3 yrs)*
- d. Science 6 credits (3 yrs)
- e. Language 4 credits (2 years of the same language)*
- f. VAPA 2 credits (1 yr)
- g. College Prep 2 credits (1 yr)



Additional District Requirements (12 credits)

- P.E. or JROTC 4 semesters (2 yrs)
 (must pass the FitnessGram)
- Electives 8 credits
 - -Can complete additional a-g courses
 - -Music, Art, Theatre, Technical theatre, and other elective courses



One G difference between middle school & high school...

In high school, if you fail a class – you (generally) have to retake it in order to graduate. If you don't earn at least 10 credits your 9th grade year, you'll be considered a 9th grader again. (Your school ID will even say 9th grade again!). "Ds" don't equal degrees—always aim for a C or better!

College Bound!

By completing the a-g requirements with a 'C' or better, you're eligible to apply to any 4 year university in the US! We'll be supporting you along the way...
